JC Payne (Victor Frankenstein) is an actor, educator, and magician based out of the DMV. He holds an Associates' in Theatre from Howard Community College and a BFA in Acting from University of Maryland, Baltimore County. Award-winning and classically trained, he's been lucky enough to play a wide range of young lovers and prickly men from Shakespeare's canon. Currently, he's spending equal time building himself up as an artist and creating opportunities for other artists to shine.

Alex Levy (director) is the Artistic Director of 1st Stage in Northern Virginia. He has extensive experience with immersive theatre, including Lýkos Ánthrōpos by Bob Bartlett, which he staged in a remote clearing in the woods in Maryland and then again last year here at the Congressional Cemetery. Previously he worked with Bob Bartlett on Duck Harbor and the world premier of Swimming With Whales (Helen Hayes nomination for Outstanding Director and Outstanding production). His award-winning play Safe at Home (co-created with Gabriel Greene) was staged at baseball stadiums around the country. He produced Hollywood in the Hood a walking production staged throughout the Watts neighborhood in Los Angeles. Since joining 1st Stage, the company has won several awards including the American Theatre Wing's "National Theatre Company Grant," The Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding

Production in 2025, 2020 and 2019, and was named "One of America's most impressive smaller theater companies" by The Wall Street Journal. Levy is a five-time Helen Hayes nominee for "Outstanding Director," and his production of Lobby Hero was named best regional revival of 2016 by The Wall Street Journal. Before joining 1st Stage, Mr. Levy served as the Artistic Director of Ballybeg Theatre in New York City, Managing Director of The Watts Village Theatre Company in Los Angeles and Artistic Director of Pegasus Players in Chicago. He directed the national tour of America, Amerique for Jenna Productions and has three times been chosen by the United States Department of State to lead international tours through India, Jordan, Morocco, Turkey and Egypt. Mr. Levy holds an MFA in Directing from UCLA.

Kenny Neal (sound design) is a Helen Hayes Award-winning sound designer and composer. DC area credits include: Signature Theatre: Strategic Love Play, Job; Studio Theatre: Downstate, English; Round House Theatre: Sojourners, The Seafarer; Mosaic Theatre: Precarious, Private; 1st Stage: The Last Match, columbinus; The Kennedy Center: She a Gem, Digging Up Dessa; Olney Theatre Center: A Nice Indian Boy, Dance Nation; Faction of Fools: How the Sausage Gets Made, The Moors; NextStop Theatre: Footloose, Eurydice; Taffety Punk: Pramkicker, Mom Baby God; Rorschach Theatre: Dracula: A Feminist Revenge Fantasy, She Kills Monsters; Pinky Swear Productions: Over Her Dead Body, Lizzie: The Musical; Welders: Happiness (and Other Reasons to Die); Solas Nua: Lie Low; Theatre J: Becoming Dr. Ruth; Keegan Theatre: Airness; Prologue Theatre: Recent Tragic Events; Constellation Theatre Company: The Master and Margarita; Theater Alliance: Klytemnestra; Factory 449: Agnes of God; as well as numerous productions for Adventure Theatre, Imagination Stage, and Regional credits include: Barrington Stage (MA), Cleveland Playhouse (OH), The Village Theatre (WA), and The Maltz Jupiter Theatre (FL).

Bob Bartlett's (playwright) plays include Love And Vinyl (Kitchen Dog; Byrdland Records; KA-CHUNK!! Records), Mediocre White Men, Writing in Diners, and A Boy On A Bed; Union, a sometimes fiction chronicling Walt Whitman's years living and loving in Washington, DC during the Civil War; E2, a contemporary reimagining of Marlowe's Edward II, which premiered at Maryland's Rep Stage; Swimming With Whales (1st Stage - six Helen Hayes Awards nominations); Happiness (And Other Reasons To Die) (The Welders); The Accident Bear (The Avenue Laundromat); Lýkos Ánthrōpos (Congressional Cemetery); and Bareback Ink, a queer reimagining of the Ganymede myth, which recently had runs at the Capital and Edinburgh Fringe Festivals and NYC's Hard Sparks. His O'Neill finalist, The Regular, will be a part of this season's Script Tease series at Baltimore's Everyman Theatre.

Bartlett is an affiliated artist with the National New Play Network and a member of The Dramatists Guild of America. He lives in Central Maryland in an old farmhouse and is a founding member of The Welders. He earned the MFA in Playwriting at Catholic University of America, and he is a retiring member of the theatre faculty at Bowie State University in Maryland, where he teaches dramatic literature, playwriting, and screenwriting. He is the recipient of the 2022 University System of Maryland Board of Regents Award for Excellence in Research, Scholarship, or Creative Activity.
